### ◆ ABOUT US

Naugachia Jan Vikas Lok Karyakram (Nau Jan Lok) is a non-government, non-profit, democratic, secular, and social organization dedicated to the holistic development of the marginalized rural and urban communities in Bihar. Nau Jan Lok is registered under the Indian Society Registration Act 21, 1860 on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 1987 with the govt. of Bihar, Patna. It is also registered under Section 12(A) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 in the year 1991-92 and under the FCR Act, 1976 in the year 1991<sup>1</sup>. Since its inception, Nau Jan Lok is working to reduce the vulnerabilities of the marginalized communities concerning various issues. We are presently operational in **07** blocks of Naugachia subdivision in Bhagalpur district and **02** blocks of Khagaria district in Bihar. Through our good work, we have achieved a special recognition among the poor and marginalized communities for whom we are working for.

### ◆ VISION

To establish and strengthen a civil society/social order that is just, equitable, and humane. This vision is supported not only by the United Nations Charter of Human Rights but also by the thrusts of the constitution of India that assures to all its citizens-justice (Social, Economic, and Political) liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship, equality of status, opportunity and fraternity assuring the dignity of the individuals and the unity of the Nation.

To establish an egalitarian society with holistic approaches where equality of status and opportunity assures the dignity of the individuals and the unity of the nation.

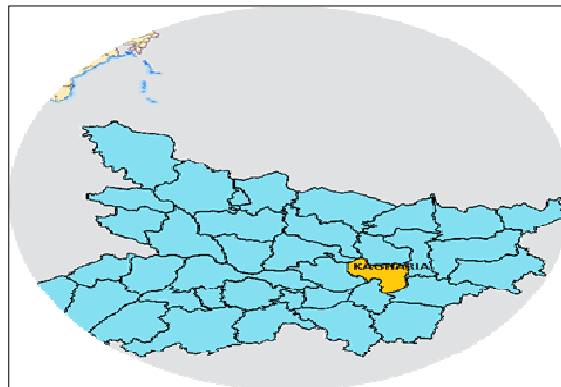
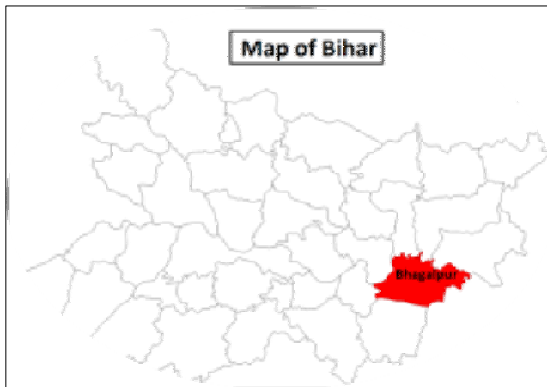
### ◆ OBJECTIVES

- a. To provide help and support to the neglected, oppressed, poor, and helpless rural and urban women, girls, and children.
- b. To aware, sensitize and capacitate the small, marginal, and poor farmers for sustainable agriculture practices and livelihood security.
- c. To mainstream the poorest of the poor in all developmental aspects.
- d. To aware, sensitize, and empower adolescent boys and girls on reproductive health and rights.
- e. To provide shelter, relief, and rehabilitation to flood, disasters, and waterlogged victims.
- f. To empower poor rural women socially and economically through awareness and livelihood generation programs.
- g. To promote investment and IGAs among the poor rural and urban poor people for their self-reliance.
- h. To aware and sensitize rural labor about their rights and ensure work opportunity.

- j. To empower and strengthen local governance system for the overall development of the villages.

## ◆ OPERATIONAL AREA



Nau Jan Lok is operational in more than **120** villages of the Naugachia, Kharik, Bihpur, Narayanpur, Gopalpur, Ismailpur, and Rangra blocks in Naugachia subdivision in Bhagalpur district in Bihar. Under the Child Line and Literacy Centre Projects, we are also operational in Khagaria and Mansi blocks in Khagaria district in Bihar.

## ◆ TARGETED POPULATIONS

- a. Downtrodden and marginalized communities residing in the rural and urban areas.
- b. Neglected, oppressed, poor and helpless women, girls, and children.
- c. Small and marginal farmers.
- d. Poorest of the poor.

- g. Local vaidya and traditional doctors.
- h. Rural labors.

## PROGRAMS IMPLEMENTED DURING THE YEAR

(1) **Child Line 1098 Project:** Perhaps the most disadvantaged group in India is the millions of street children who live or work on the street. Street children have fallen through society's cracks – there are few ladders for them to climb back up. They live as their parents did and as their children are likely to do. Children live and work on the street because their parents are poor, or they are orphans, or they have run away from home, often to escape abuse. They are invariably malnourished, receive scant education or medical treatment, and are involved in child labour from an early age. Child prostitution and sexual abuse are also major problems, as is an addiction to drugs. These children live in a different world to the emerging middle class. Taken as a separate nation they represent one of the neediest peoples on the planet.

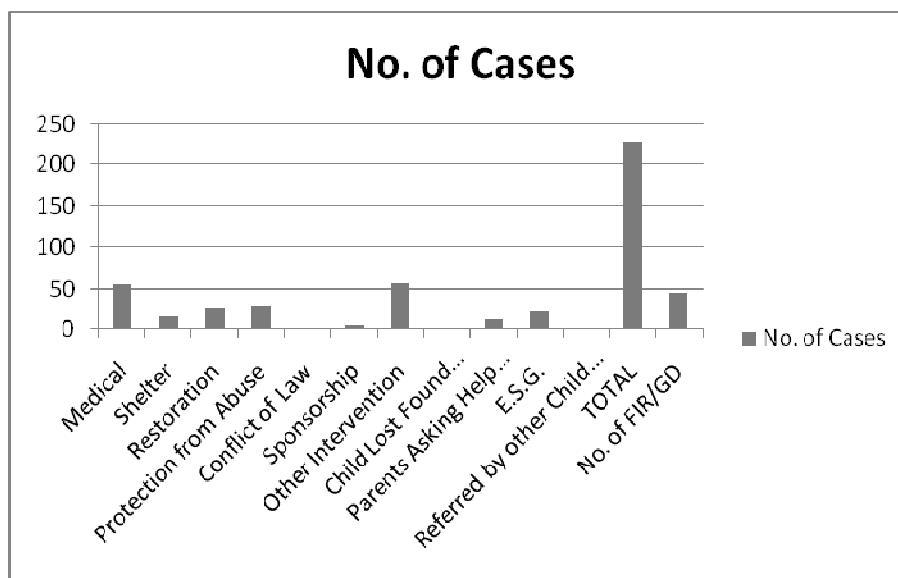
In Naugachia subdivision in Bhagalpur district in Bihar, the problems of street children are many. In 2019-20, we covered all **07** blocks namely Naugachia, Kharik, Bihpur, Rangara, Ismailpur, Narayanpur, and Gopalpur where there are hundreds of thousands of destitute, runaway and orphaned children living in the hand-to-mouth situation. For them, education is an unattainable luxury or irrelevant. They lost their childhoods and have little hope for a better future.

Supported under the joint aegis of the Ministry of Child Development, Govt. of India and Child Line India Foundation, Mumbai we are implementing Child Line 1098 Project with great success and have undertaken different interventions for street children (age group 0-

18 years) living in difficult circumstances and also advocates for child rights. To make the child Line 1098 project a success, efforts are being made to link this program with govt. offices in Bihar that are working on different child issues.

### Activities Implemented

**A. Case Interventions:** Although, Nau Jan Lok work for the protection of the rights of all children in general but we give special emphasis to vulnerable children in the age group 0-18 years, who need care and protection that include street children living alone on the streets, child laborers working in the unorganized and organized sectors, children affected by physical/sexual/emotional abuse in the family, schools or institutions, children who need emotional support and guidance, abandoned children, missing children, runaway children, children who are victims of substance abuse, differently-able children and mentally challenged. In 2019-20, a total of **228** such cases were successfully solved with no. of FIR/GD were **45**. The details of case interventions are as follows:



**B. Open House Program:** Open House Program is an “open forum for children” to raise issues/problems faced by them to the Child Line team. This forum allows children to be heard and seek support from the government systems. In 2019-20, a total of **12** Open Houses were arranged in **12** villages of the Kharik, Bihpur, Ismailpur and Naugachia blocks of Bhagalpur district to meet out this objective. Held once in a month, these open house programs disseminated information to **444** children and villagers about the basic facilities provided to the children in schools. It also helped in identifying problems faced by children

and receiving their feedback on the basic facilities that were provided to them in the schools. Problems like toilets, buildings, books, dresses, mid-day meals in schools, and how to solve them by giving applications to the govt. officials and school authorities were discussed at length.

Nau Jan Lok is also doing advocacy with the concerned child line officials and departments to solve the problems of children. The children and villagers present on the occasion were informed that if there is any problem in the schools or other departments related to the children, they were encouraged to call Child Line free emergency phone 1098 and the Child Line team will come for their help.



**C. Awareness Programs:** On the occasion of “BAL DIWAS”, a series of awareness programs were organized in 4 blocks namely Naugachia, Bihpur, Kharik and Ismailpur of Bhagalpur district in Bihar to promote “integrated child protection scheme” implemented by the Ministry of women and child development, Govt. of India. The details of the awareness programs are as follows:

In these awareness programs/campaigns, 429 villagers were informed about child Line, a free 24-hour emergency telephone helpline number 1098. The awareness rally and cultural programs were instrumental in raising awareness of the villagers on social evils like child marriages, child trafficking, child crime, child atrocity and child rights. Prize distributions were also made for cultural and sports events. These programs promoted the hidden talents of children also by making them participate in the paintings and signature programs. The awareness was also promoted to help children in distress by taking the services of Child Line on free emergency phone number 1098.

**D. Block Level Meetings of the BCAB:** The Block Level CHILD LINE Advisory Board (BCAB) is the principal policy-making body of Child Line at the city and block level. The CAB is the principal policy-making body of CHILDLINE at the city & Block level and is responsible for ensuring the effective functioning of CHILDLINE. The board comprises government officials, NGOs, corporate and concerned individuals. The key functions of the CAB are to review the functioning of CHILDLINE and suggest measures to enhance the service.



In 2019-20, **06** Block Level CHILD LINE Advisory Board (BCAB) meetings were organized by Nau Jan Lok at Naugachia, Kharik, Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks in Bhagalpur district in which **120** CAB members participated. These meetings were presided by the Block Development Officer with the able participation of the Pramukh, Up-Pramukh, Zonal Officer, Child Development Officer, In charge of Police Station, Incharge of PHCs and Sarpanch of the Panchayat Samiti. Elaborative discussions were made on the progress of the Child Line and each and everyone was urged to cooperate in it. To make the Child Line program a success, it was decided to keep the stray children in Kasturba Gandhi Girls' Residential Schools by the police stations for short stays. The child development officer also gave information on the "upbringing schemes" for orphans and children affected by HIV and leprosy. It was also decided to organize quarterly BCAB meetings to improve child protection with the support of allied system organizations.

**E. Meeting of the Resource Organizations:** A meeting of the Resource Organizations was organized at the community hall of Nau Jan Lok at Naugachia on 29.09.2019. A total of **70** NGO representatives and social workers participated in the meetings with success. Mr. M. M. Thakur, Secretary of Nau Jan Lok gave an overview of the Child Line 1098 project and emphasized the importance of its publicity at the subdivision level. A brief description of the Child Line 1098 project was presented by Mr. Mukesh Kumar-Team Leader and Team Members like Mr. Arun Kumar, Mr. Sanjay Kumar, Mr. Saroj Kumar and Mr. Nawab Shahab to the participants. They informed participants that Child Line 1098 is a national, 24-hour, free emergency telephone helpline and outreach service for children in need of care and protection aims to reach out to all children in distress aged 0-18 years. Child Line provides interventions of shelter, medical, restoration, rescue, sponsorships, and emotional support and guidance and linking them to long-term services. The participants were told to use 1098 services regularly to support needy and helpless children. It was also decided to arrange meetings of the Resource Organization preferably every quarter.



**F. Promotional Program:** For the promotion of Child Line 1098 Project in an effective manner, a series of promotional programs in the form of meetings were organized. In these meetings, information was provided on 1098-free emergency phone services and other child issues. In 2019-20, a total of **16** promotional programs organized successfully participated by a total of **391** volunteers, guards, ANM, ICDS workers, ASHA, and PRIs. The



participants were urged for the promotion of Child Line services in their area and to give their full support for the success of the Child Line's 1098 free emergency phone services in Bhagalpur district.

**G. Awareness in Schools:** A series of school awareness programs on Child Line 1098 Project was organized through which **12** high and middle schools of the Khagaria and Mansi blocks of Khagaria district were covered. A total of **844** children benefitted. In this program, the children were informed that Child Line 1098 is a project of the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt. of India through which children who are exploited, victimized, missing, wandering, orphaned, destitute, disabled and affected by child marriages are helped immediately by calling Child Line's free 1098 phone service.



**(II) Misereor/KZE Project:** With esteemed support from MISEREOR/KZE, Germany- Nau Jan Lok has been implementing a community-based project in **30** villages of the Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks of the Naugachia subdivision in Bhagalpur district in Bihar. The project aims to work for livelihood promotion, agricultural promotion, DRR, climate change, village development and health issues of the poor and underserved population in an integrated manner.

### **Activities Implemented**

**A. Livelihood Training Programs:** Different livelihood skill training programs were conducted for women SHGs in different trades like- (i) Vermin Composting (ii) Advanced Cloth Making (iii) Jute Bag Making (iv) Solar Lamp (v) Bio-Sand Water Filter and (vi) Vegetable Cultivation. A total of **1255** women successfully received training in these trades. The goal of these livelihood training was to improve the poor socio-economic condition of SHG women. The women learned these skills with sincerity and now successfully involved in IGAs and improving their poor living conditions.

### ***Highlights of Achievements***

♦ *Training in vermin composting was organized in 13 villages of the Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks in Bhagalpur district that helped women SHG members on the process of making vermin composting and probable income generation opportunities. Nau Jan Lok wants to promote organic farming practices as it does not have harmful effects on the human body and also necessary for the protection of the environment. 432 women have adopted organic farming practices with increased yields and income.*

♦ *Training in advanced cloth making was organized in 6 villages of the Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks in Bhagalpur district through which 191 women were trained. They are now doing cutting and sewing of cloth items like petticoats, blouses, suits, pants, and shirts. At present, women are doing tailoring work by taking loans from their respective SHGs and are also regularly paying the loan. The follow up of the progress of trained women is also being done by Project Manager of Jeevika project and community coordinator and community mobilizers.*

♦ *Training in Jute bag making was organized in Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks in Bhagalpur district. Before conducting the training, a detailed discussion was made on the training strategy and marketing of jute bags with SHGs in the cluster meetings by the Project Manager of Jeevika. A total of 60 women received training by Mohammad Gyas and Meera Devi, the experienced trainers of Nau Jan Lok. Beneficiaries were trained in making various types of items like fancy lady bags, marketing bags, school bags, etc. 12 SHG women members are producing Jute Bag Items and generating income with sustainability.*

♦ *Training in Solar Lamp making was organized in Bihpur block in Bhagalpur district. The objectives of the training were to save electricity, get good light at a low cost when there is no electricity and generate self-employment opportunities if there is no electricity. 12 SHG women members are now producing solar lamps in their homes and generating income with sustainability.*

♦ *347 SHG women members were trained in vegetable gardening with raised know-how of the important topics of vegetable gardening like types of seasonal vegetables, nursery preparation, irrigation methods, seed collection, soil testing, etc. 144 women members of the SHGs are now doing vegetable gardening with the organic process and earning maximum profits.*

♦ *201 SHG women members of 6 villages of Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks were trained in Bio Sand Water Filter making with raised know-how of the harm of contaminated water, the importance of drinking clean water to remain healthy and how to prepare good filters at homes. 165 women are now drinking filtered water and leading a healthy life.*



**B. Disaster Management Awareness Program:** Regular training programs of one/two days duration were organized in **25** villages of the Bihpur-16 and Ismailpur-19 blocks of the Naugachia subdivision through which **920** SHG women members were informed about disaster management techniques. The training covered awareness about how to manage disasters in rural areas, what needs to be done when a disaster occurs, and about the harm and benefits of the disasters.

As a result, DMC and DMTF have been formed in all **25** villages of the Bihpur and Ismailpur blocks in Bhagalpur district to prevent disaster. Awareness also promoted among people about the disaster and how the cooperation of the govt. officials and PRIs should be taken during the disaster. DMTFs are now very active in every village to deal with the future disaster.



### SUCCESS STORY-1

*Sobha Kumari W/O Pankaj Mandal belongs to a poor family. She was married in 2014 but living in poverty. Her husband was a daily wage labourer in Punjab. In 2016, Sobha joined "Shanti SHG" and started saving money weekly. On 12/10/2019, Sobha received training in vegetable gardening and vermin composting under the Misereor project. After training, Sobha started vegetable gardening in her small piece of land. She took a loan of Rs. 4,000/- from her Self-Help Groups and cultivated cauliflowers in her land. She also called her husband from Punjab and together they worked hard and did vegetable cultivation. As vegetable yield was good and she made a profit of Rs.15,000/-, so she repaid the loans taken from the group very quickly. The training has made wonder to Sobha's life and she has become self-sufficient now.*

### SUCCESS STORY-2

*The Bhagwatipur village is located in the north of Ganges. As this village is arsenic prone so most of the hand pumps give arsenic water that causes skin diseases and diarrhea to the people. Sobha Devi is matric pass. She joined a one-day water filter training by Nau Jan Lok in 2019. She took the training sincerely and learned how to prepare a good filter at a low cost. After training, Sobha Devi made a water filter at a very low cost of Rs. 40/- and used it for the benefits of her family and also guided 120 women to make water filters in homes. Now, the villagers are drinking safe water of bio-sand water filters and getting rid of diseases. This training by Nau Jan Lok was extremely helpful for the villagers.*

### SUCCESS STORY-3

*Kavita Devi took 21-day training in jute bag making by Nau Jan Lok in January 2020. Before training, she used to do stitching and harvesting but the economic condition of her family was not good. She has a five-member family and her husband was a laborer. After training in jute bag making, she brought a Jute Bag Machine from her self-help group by taking a loan of Rs. 8,000/- and started preparing jute bags. She sells them at local markets and village Haat and generated a good income. She returned the loan in two months.*

*Kavita Devi tells that her family was not able to live well because of poverty but now she earns Rs. 400- Rs.500 in a day from jute bags selling. She repeatedly thanks Nau Jan Lok for her improved economic condition. Now, she also imparts skills to other poor rural women in jute bag making for their economic self-reliance.*

**(III) DRR PROGRAM: SSP, MUMBAI:** Since 2011, Nau Jan Lok has been involved in addressing the DRR and Climate Change issues within the network of the MISEREOR partners across Bihar with the support of SSP, Mumbai. The following activities were carried out during 2019-20:

**(1) Agriculture Based Skill Development Training Program (Organic Farming):** Organic farming practices in India is not new and is being followed from ancient times. It is a method of a farming system which primarily aimed at cultivating the land and raising crops in such a way, as to keep the soil alive and in good health by use of organic wastes (crop, animal and farm wastes, aquatic wastes) and other biological materials along with beneficial microbes (bio-fertilizers) to release nutrients to crops for increased sustainable production in an eco-friendly pollution-free environment.

On 23/10/2019, a training program on organic farming and organic manure preparation was organized on 23.10.19 in Suraha village of Kharik block in which **42** participants participated. Mr. Gautam Kumar- Trainer informed participants about the methods of organic farming practices. The objective of this training was to avoid the side effects of chemical fertilizer on the crops and to promote the use of organic farming practices in the agriculture fields. Now, a total of **14** members of the **05** women SHGs are producing organic manure, selling it, and also adopting organic farming practices in their fields. Through this

training program, organic farming is well promoted in Suraha and adjoining villages of the Kharik block.

(2) **CRF (Micro Loan Distribution):** Rural women are still viewed as mere labour in agriculture, agri-allied activities and family enterprises. Social norms and lack of opportunities to start a business restrict women from taking the lead and setting up their enterprises. Also, the fear of failure, business loss and debts hamper women from taking the first step towards entrepreneurship and deters them from launching new businesses. Therefore, Nau Jan Lok with the support of SSP, Mumbai creates an aspiration for entrepreneurship within women by distributing microloans to SHGs.

03 SHGs were distributed a total sum of **Rs. 45,000/-** as microloan by Nau Jan Lok so that the poor women of the groups may able to start small IGAs and should sustainably increase their income. At present, women are running grocery shops and producing organic fertilizers thus increasing their income to lead a good life. They have also informed other members of the groups about waste management and environmental conservation measures.



(3) **Capacity Building Training/Disaster Task Force Formation:** The details are as follows:

The training was conducted by Mr. Gautam Kumar of SSP who informed participants about what needs to be done during the disaster. He informed on various options to avoid disaster in Suraha village because it is a disaster-prone area. Every year there is a flood problem in Suraha village due to which there is a loss of human life, livestock, etc.

With the efforts of Nau Jan Lok, a women's Task Force (WTF) was formed in village Suraha to prevent flood problems/disaster. WTF works mainly for disaster awareness in the village, preparation of village resource maps, starting disaster relief fund and how to take the



support of government machinery, PRIs and others when a disaster occurs. Because of the sincere work of WTF in Suraha village people have now become fearless from Disaster and the good work of WTF is also being publicized to adjoining villages as well.

**(IV) EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS**: With the financial support from "Solidarity Group of Eugendorf", efforts were made to educate children of the poor and Mahadalit communities by running **11** education centers in Khagaria and Mansi blocks in Khagaria district in Bihar. The details of the education centers are as follows:
